Smart Card/Common Access Card (CAC) Application Descriptions

- ◆ **Card Maintenance** – The application resides on a stand-alone computer based system and writes cardholder information (Meal Entitlement Code, Unit Identification Code, military occupational specialty, weight, address, phone number, etc.) to a Smart Card/Common Access Card (CAC). Information (data elements) contained on the Smart Card/CAC can be extracted using Card Maintenance, and then restored to the CAC with the same basic demographic (Name and Social Security Number) information. This function is called Copy Card.
- ◆ **Food Service Application** – The current configuration operates on client workstations networked to a host Back Office database or stand-alone workstations providing downloads to the host Back Office using a diskette. See the PDF attachment.
- ◆ **Manifest Tracking** - Manifest Tracking is a software application that enables users to efficiently track military personnel and their baggage. As military personnel arrive at a location, or embark and debark on a mission, they are registered to a file. Individuals can register by presenting their Smart Cards, or the operator can enter the individual's data manually. The application also produces a electronic file that automates manifest input to the Global Transportation Network. Processing time for manifesting in the past took up to four hours. That time has been reduced to less than an hour using Manifest Tracking and Smart Cards/CACs.
- ◆ **Warrior Readiness** - Warrior Readiness accepts Smart Cards/CACs from all services and makes readiness decisions based upon user-specified readiness criteria. The database component can operate in tandem, or separate from the Smart Card/CAC. Automated and proactive readiness reports are produced. Warrior Readiness has revolutionized the Soldiers Readiness Processing for the 17,000 soldiers in Hawaii. The former paper system was capable of processing about 200 people per day. With Warrior Readiness over 1,700 people can be processed each day. Each person is saved a minimum of 2 hours during each session of Soldier Readiness Processing.
- ◆ **Weapons Issuance** - Weapons Issuance is a software application that maintains a database of inventory items, user information, operator privileges, maintenance and historical information on items stored, issued and maintained in one or more armories. Duties in the armory have been significantly simplified by automating the paperwork and record processes associated with sensitive item inventories and weapons.
